To make this happen, we provide innovative, cutting-edge sensory and assistive technology, specialist training and technical support to children's palliative care services throughout Britain and Ireland, reaching over 13,500 children and families every year.

Children and young people with life-limiting conditions face many challenges, including chronic pain and discomfort, a cycle of clinical interventions, loss of independence and social isolation. Our technology helps tear down these barriers, bringing families together in fun, joyful and meaningful ways.

Many of the children we support will live shortened lives. Our mission is therefore crucial: to help children live as well as possible, for as long as possible, even in their final days.

Over the next five years, we have ambitious plans to increase the number of children and young people accessing our life-changing technology. We also know that some families choose to care for their children exclusively at home. To increase access further, we are actively exploring ways to support parents by developing training content and knowledge sharing to help them maximise the use of accessible technology at home.

Shay's story

Shay is an enthusiastic gamer and loves to use our technology when he visits his local hospice. He can enjoy worlds of excitement using special adaptive controls or get lost in the adventures of VR gaming. Shay's dad, Alan, explains the impact Lifelites has had on Shay who has Pearson syndrome, an incredibly rare mitochondrial disease that affects multiple organs:

“Gaming gives Shay an opportunity to connect with his peers and control something for himself. Video games have been fantastic for Shay. They keep him believing he is a normal kid; he would not be able to play football with friends, but he can play FIFA! It provides a shared interest and it lets him compete on the same level, even though he has a disability.”

“Shay's condition has affected his memory, but when he's playing online with his friends, they're flowing, they're chatting away. Shay doesn't know a lot about his condition, but he knows he's different from other children. This technology gets him away from it. He doesn't think about his feeding tube or his medicines as he plays.”
